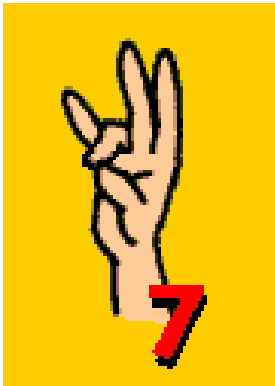

Helpful Study Hints

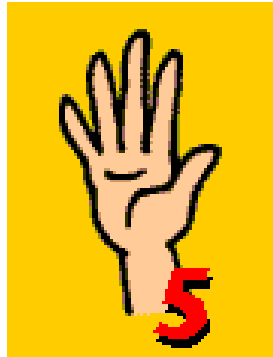
1.) Make sure you go through each lesson.

Manual Start

1.) Turn the computer on and start Windows 98/ME/2000/XP. Please close any other programs that you have running.

2.) Place the Sign Language for Kids CD in the CD-ROM Drive.

3.) Double-click on the [My Computer] icon from your desktop.

4.) Double-click on the CD-ROM drive (usually "D").

5.) Double-click on the file the that says Sign Language for Kids.





Instructions



1.) Start the program Sign Language for kids.

2.) For numbers and the alphabet click on each picture then try to copy it with your hands. When you click on the image it will also play the sound so you will know which letter or number it is.



3.) Go through each lesson and take the test then go onto the next lesson.



4.) In the section called fun. There will be short videos of easy and common signs. Try copying them with your hands. Then go onto the test.

1.) Why did you make Sign Language for Kids?
